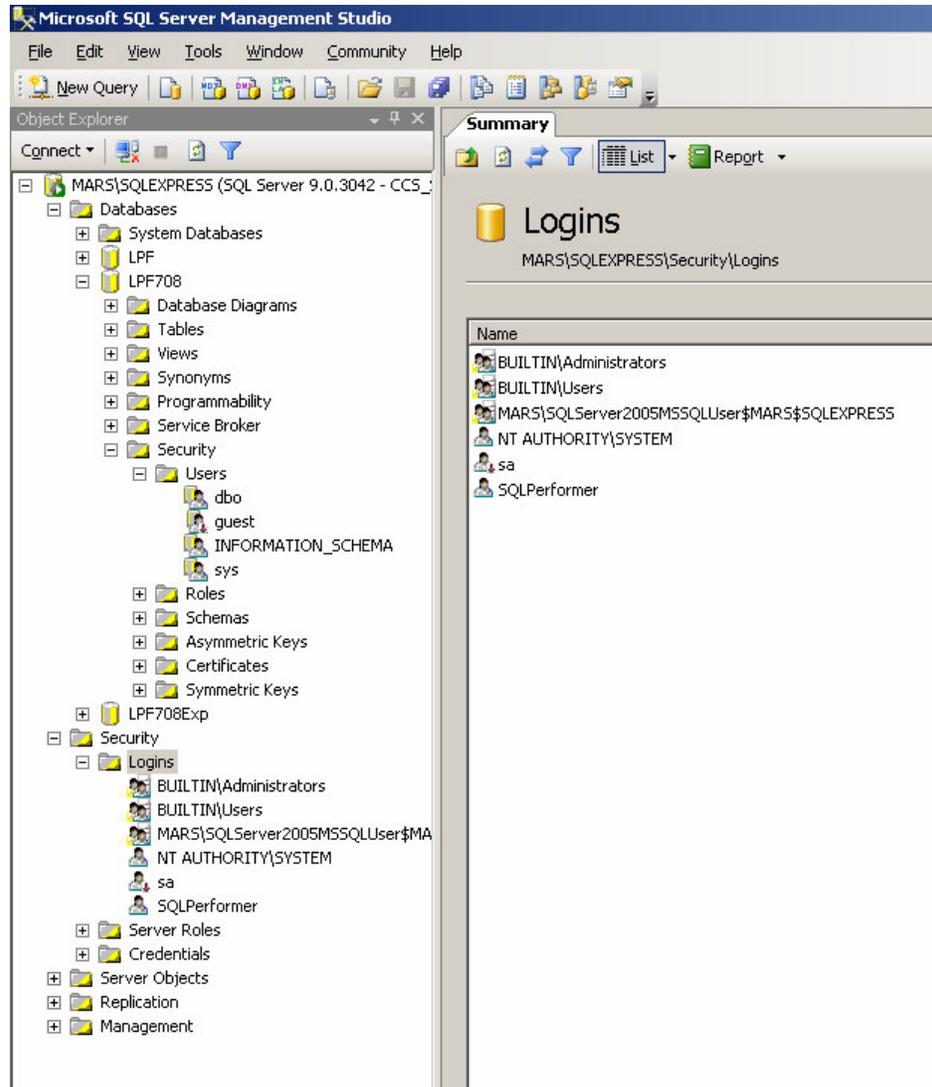
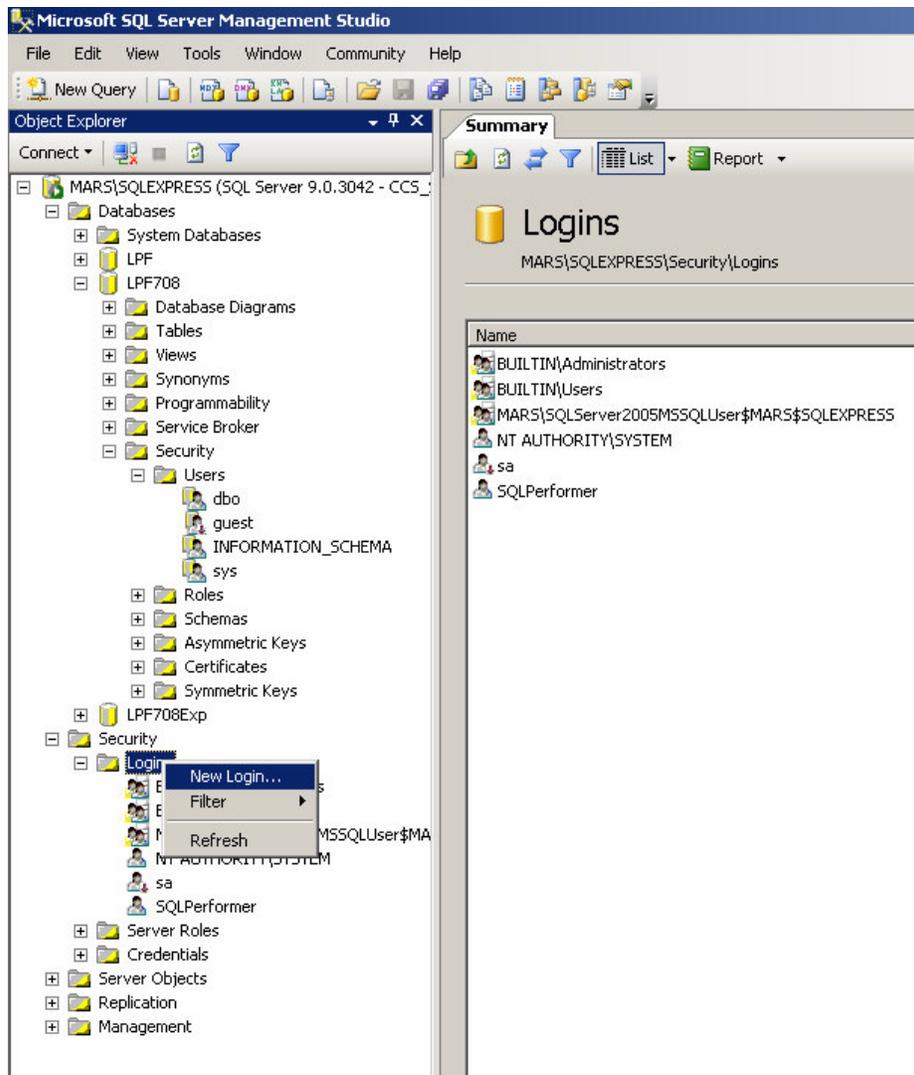


Adding Network Users to SQL Server Express Database

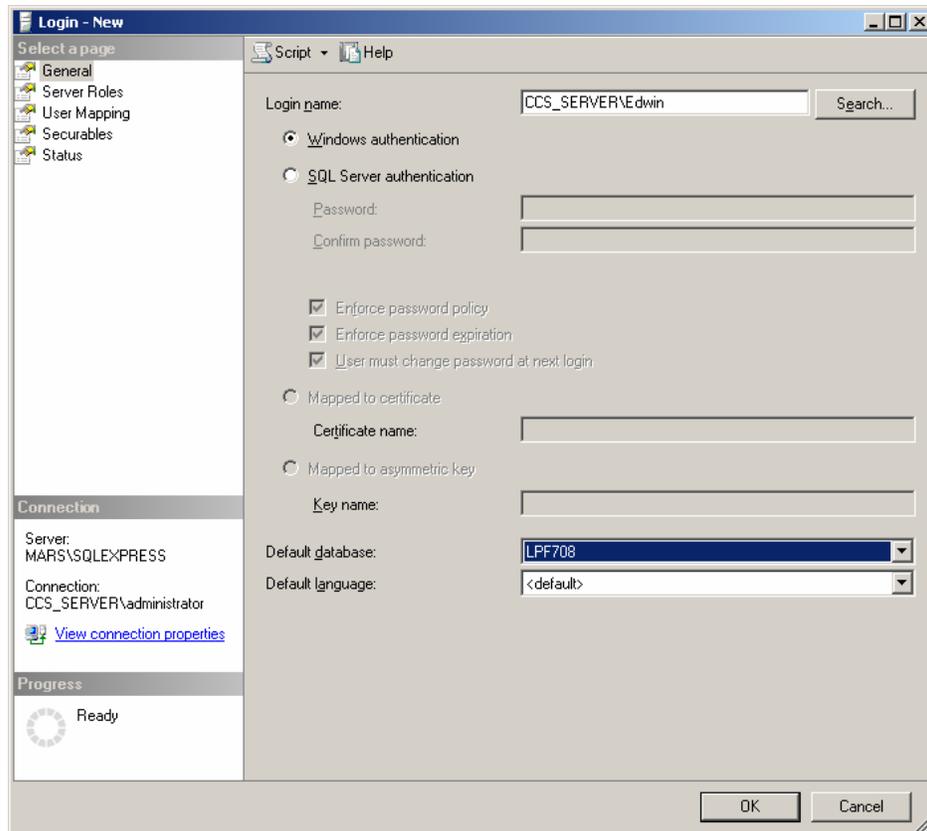
After logging in to SQL Server Express, expand the Databases folder and your LPF database folder and the Security folder as shown below:



Start by adding a new Login. This is done by right-clicking the Logins folder and selecting “New Login...” as shown below:



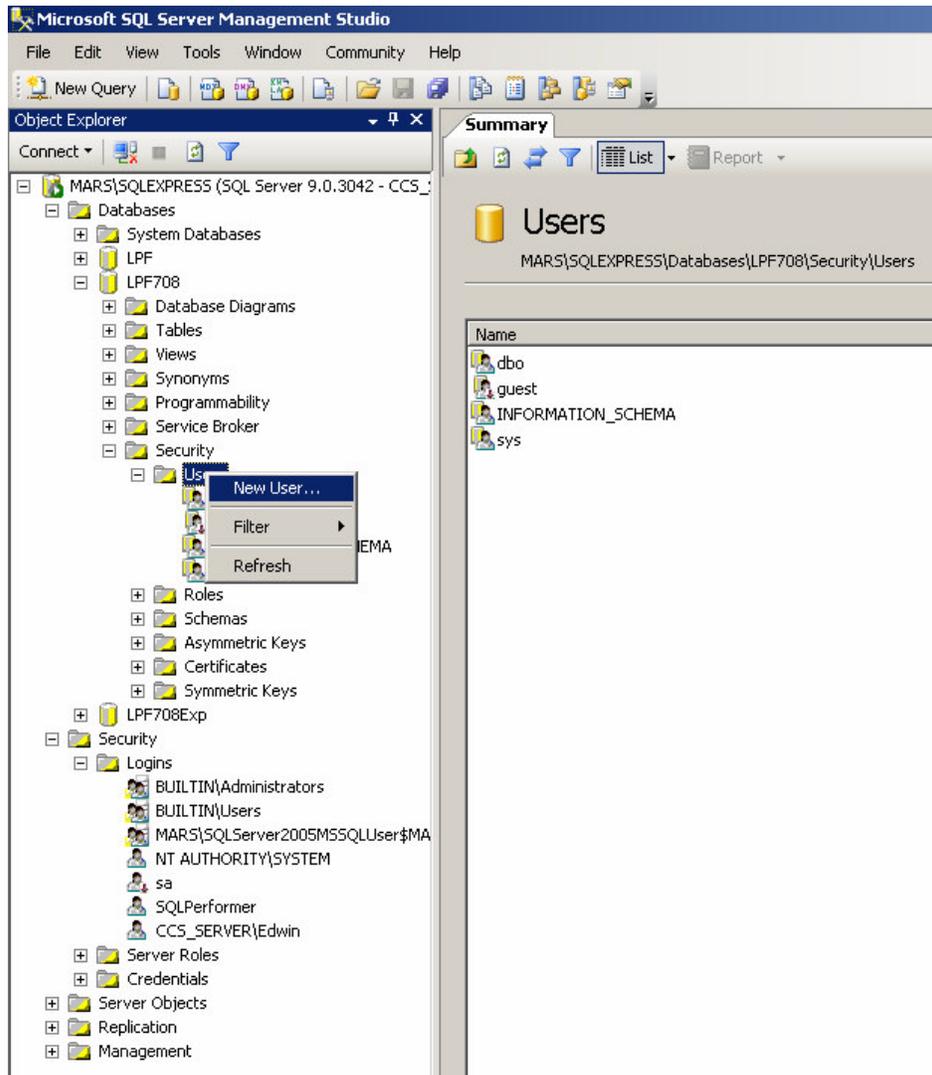
The Login – New screen is displayed. Use this screen to search for and add domain users to your SQL Server:



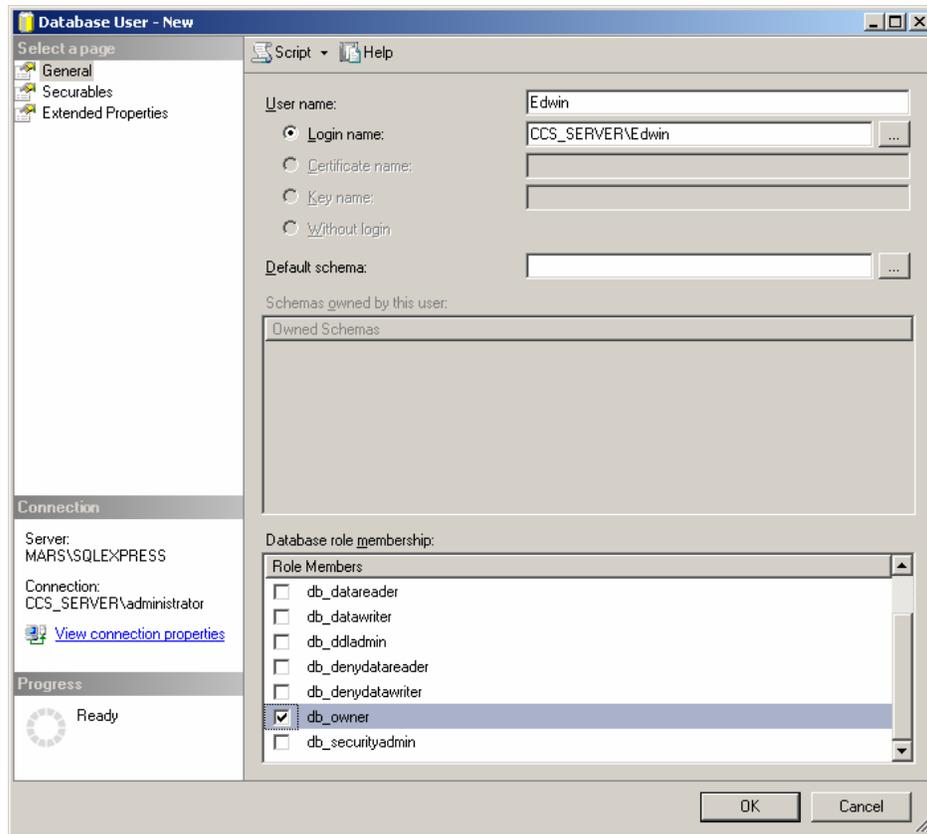
- Click on Search to search for and select domain users.
- Set it to use Windows Authentication.
- Set the Default Database to your LPF database.
- Click “Ok” to effect changes.

Try to log into LPF again at this juncture from the workstation. If this still fails, then add the domain user to your LPF database.

To add a User to your LPF database, right-click on the Users folder and select New User:

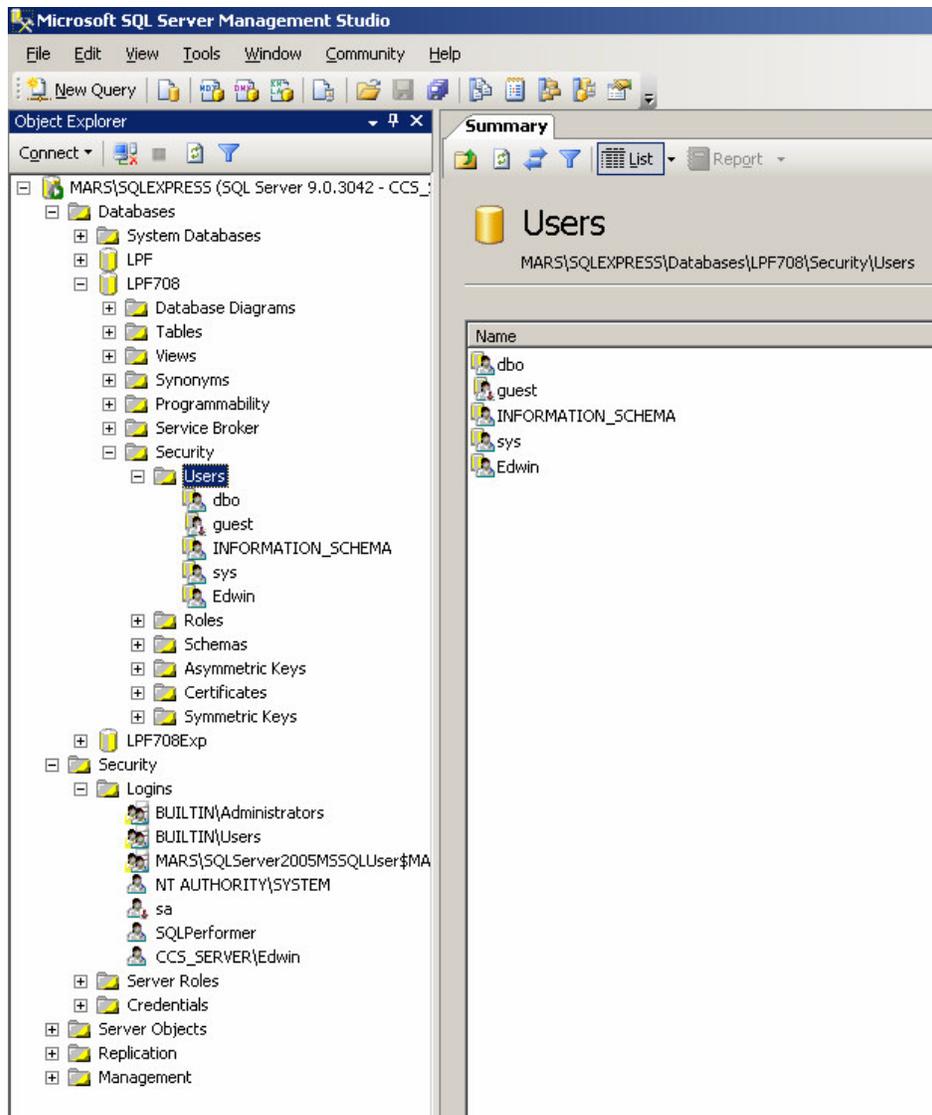


The Database User – New screen comes up. This allows you to add users existing on your domain:



- Click on the “...” button next to the Login Name test box to select your newly added Login or type it in.
- Assign the Login a User Name.
- Set the Database Role Membership as “db_owner”.
- Click “Ok” to effect changes.

Your SQL Server should look similar to below where the new user has been added:



Now login to LPF.
